aKademy 2007

The aKademy conference is an annual meeting of KDE community members. Since the community is spread all over the world, it takes place in another country every other year.

This year's aKademy will be held in the Department of Computer & Information Sciences at the University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, Scotland.

The event will span eight days and includes an exciting programme of talks and presentations by many of our outstanding KDE developers and community leaders.

Alongside the meetings, members can explore their creativity in joint development, bug-fixing & coding sessions, workshops for all KDE contributors, and design, usability and polishing work.

Since most of the community's communication is over the internet, aKademy is also one the best opportunities to meet many other KDE contributors in person.

aKademy occupies an important place in the yearly Free Software Calendar because it is here that cross-project collaboration takes place and tries to form a common platform for the Linux desktop.

The KDE project expects over 200 contributors to visit aKademy 2007 this July in Glasgow, Scotland.

Schedule

The opening of aKademy will be led by a two-day KDE Contributors Conference, followed by the general assembly of the KDE e.V. and an intensive week of developing, discussing and meeting people.

Like all the previous aKademy conferences, one of the main activities will be hacking on code. This year's focus will be on KDE 4.

At aKademy 2006 we defined the scope of KDE 4, the next generation of the KDE desktop scheduled to be released by the end of October.

The aim of the developers at aKademy 2007 will be to ensure that the KDE 4 platform achieves its ambition of creating the best user experience.

By bringing together Human Computer Interaction experts in the fields of usability, accessibility and artwork with the core library developers, we can ensure that a powerful, friendly and innovative desktop is created.

This years conference will bring all of KDE's contributors up to date with recent developments of the KDE 4 platform, including information for translators and documentation writers.

And to ensure the best integration of KDE 4, we also invited representatives from different KDE distributions.

Thanks to the availability of internet access through Wifi and Ethernet, all participants will have unlimited network access in the Development room.

For those who cannot bring a portable, aKademy provides the free use of desktop computers.

Software developers can easily deploy applications across all the major platforms with a single code base, while users enjoy greater access to standards such as the Open Document Format with the KOffice2 suite and Open Source groupware solutions through the Kontact groupware suite. Never again will your applications or data be held captive on just one computing system!

KDE is also translated into 65 different world languages and provides extensive accessibility features for those working with disabilities such as low or no vision and motor control difficulty.

Breathtaking Beauty

It is said that people eat with their eyes, and KDE4 aims to please. The Oxygen design project has brought a fresh new look and feel with a comprehensive set of artwork and design that includes icons, desktop graphics, application styling and audio. These elements are modern and elegant while emphasizing usability.

Elevating the Desktop

The new Plasma desktop, available only on Linux and Unix platforms, delivers advanced window techniques such as translucency, zooming and much more.

The desktop has been revitalized as a place users access collections of gadgets and tools to help them work better and enjoy their desktop more. With an emphasis on beauty and usability, Plasma brings common tasks within easy reach of average users with a visual design and harmony usually associated only with high end proprietary offerings.

Built in scripting (JavaScript, Python and Ruby) makes creating new gadgets, or Plasmoids, trivial, while built in networking and package makes sharing them a breeze. Kontact: groupware including calendaring, email, contacts (including corporate LDAP) and support for several groupware servers

Okular: universal document viewing and annotation with support for over a dozen formats including PDF

Education: astronomy, chemistry, math, language skills and more are

addressed in an advanced set of educational software titles

Entertainment: a collection of over 25 games including card games, sudoku and mahjongg

Software Development: Integrated IDEs for C++, C, Ruby, Python, PHP and web development

Multimedia: audio and video players

Kopete: Instant messaging that supports all the major instant messaging networks
